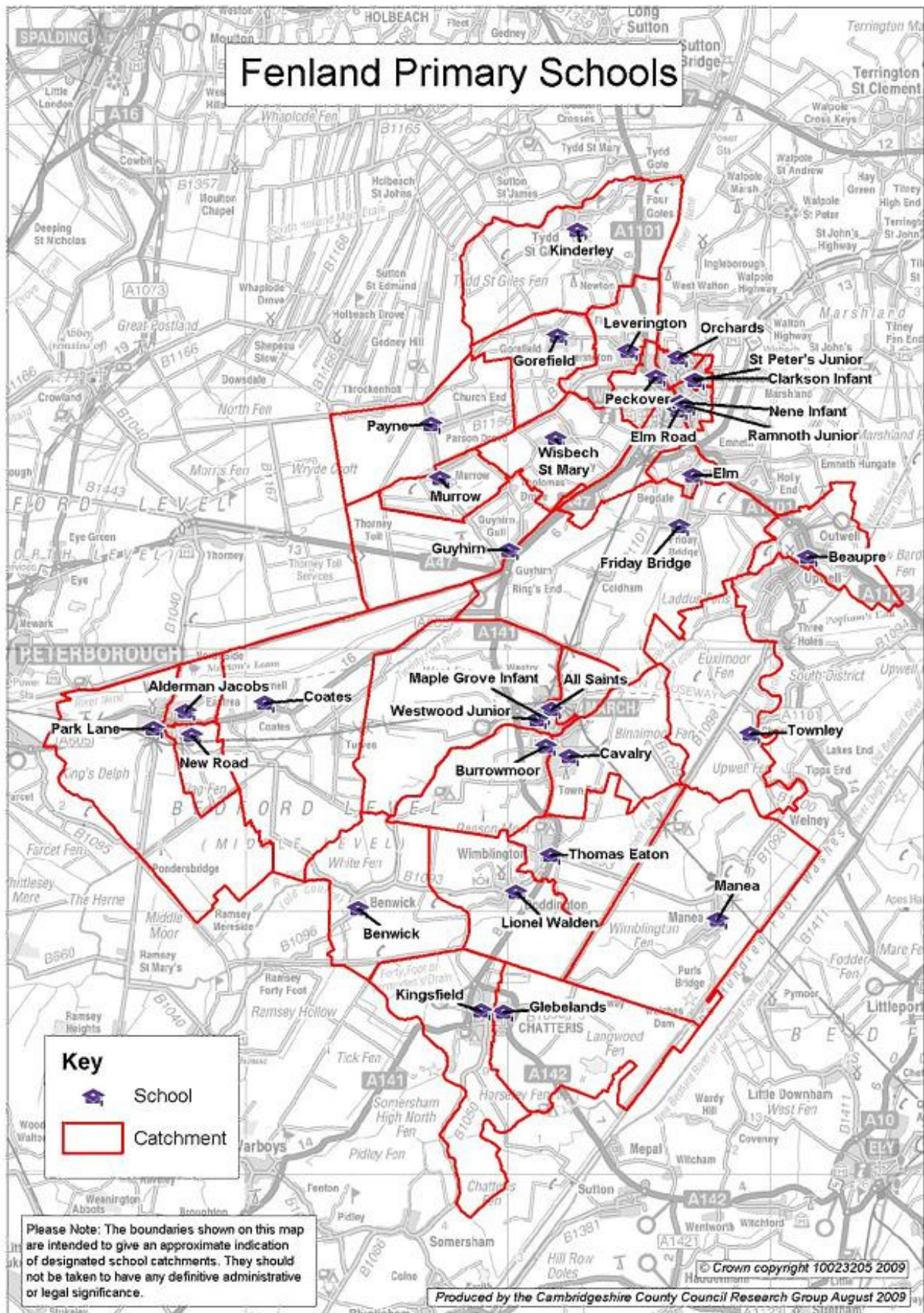

B: Practising membership under church criteria 1 and 2 will be determined by frequency of attendance by the person(s), confirmed by a letter from the priest/minister or leader, as defined in the tie-break, firstly weekly, secondly monthly and thirdly for major religious festivals, such as Easter and Christmas. For criteria 3, such practice must be in accordance with the usual discipline of that faith.

C: The school may lawfully withdraw an offer of a place where a fraudulent or intentionally misleading claim of residency in the catchment area is made and effectively denies a place to a child with a stronger claim. 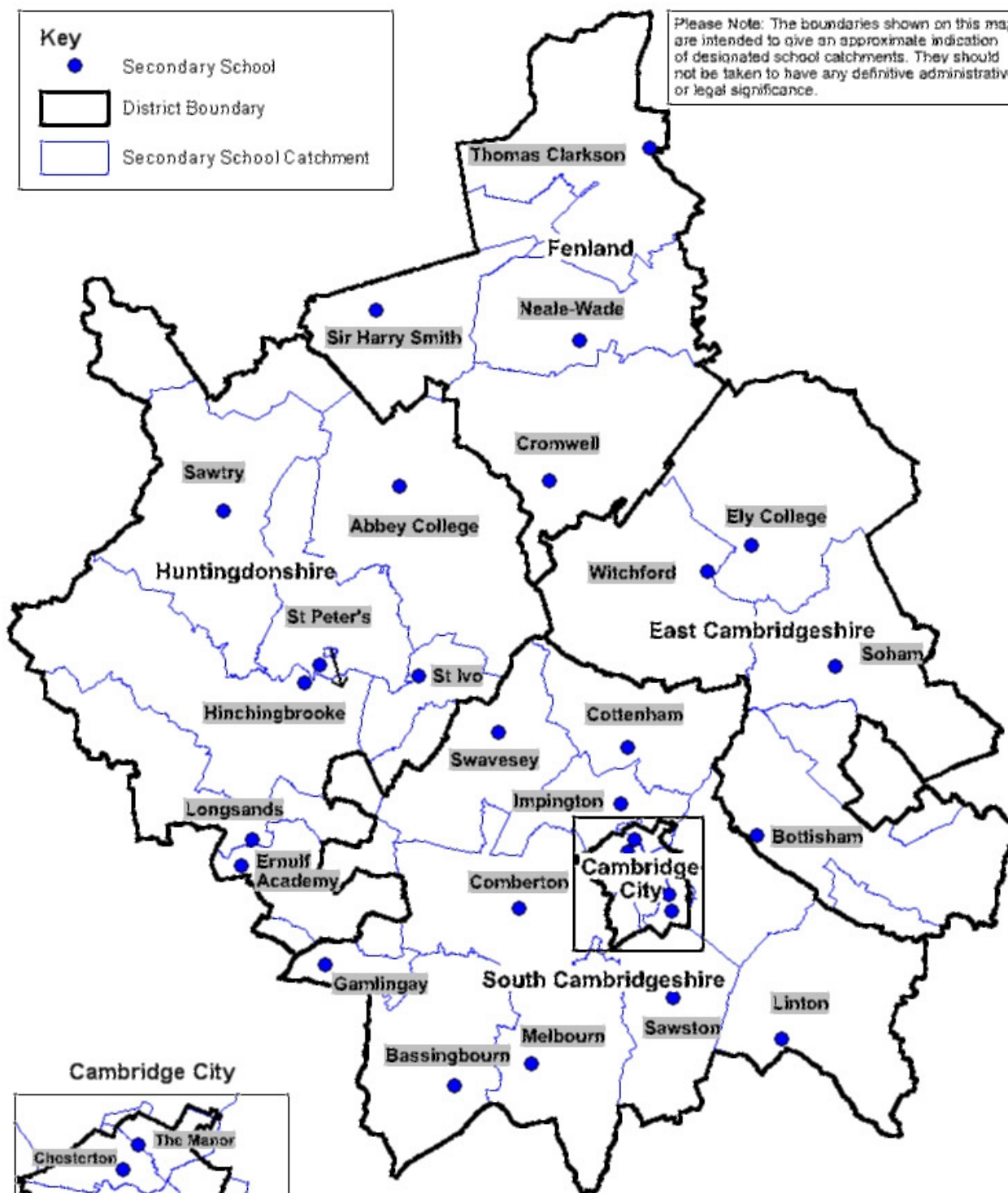
