Cambridgeshire Travel for Work Partnership

The Cambridgeshire Travel for Work Partnership (TfW) has been in existence since 1997. The Partnership works with employers to encourage their staff to use alternative forms of transport to the car. In its promotion of more environmentally preferable forms of transport TfW helps meet its wider objectives of delivering environmental, health, air quality and economic benefits to the wider community.

The Partnership's aims and objectives are set by a steering group consisting of representatives of the partners. These are the following.

TfW currently has a network of around 60 employers representing around 40,000 employees in Cambridgeshire.

The officers of TfW work with employers, helping them with the writing and implementing of site-specific travel plans. The main elements of the Partnership's work are the following.
