290/Z1 A handwritten history of Papworth Everard 'compiled' by Mr and Mrs F.W.A. Ives for submission to the Cambridgeshire Federation of Women's Institutes competition. This takes the form of a chronological account of the parish to 1949, with many photographs of buildings, clergy, groups and individuals, some being half-tones cut from publications but others original prints or apparently printed specially for the History. More than half the volume, from fo.35 onward, is largely concerned with the history of the Village Settlement, founded as the Cambridgeshire Tuberculosis Colony at neighbouring Bourn in 1915 and transferred to Papworth in 1918. This section includes 87 photographs or screened prints.

355/Z1 A duplicated typescript history of Papworth Everard by Winifred Janes , dated on the title-page 1946, based on the notes 'of the late A.J. Ollis, who though confined to bed in one of our hospitals managed to keep alive a keen interest in the village around him'.

Chapters are given on Anglo-Saxon Papworth, Domesday, the places names Papworth Everard and Agnes, the Cheere Family, inclosure, the church, Ernest Terah Hooley the financier, the Old North Road and other parish roads, and Kisby's Hut or the Three Horseshoes.

At back: 'Chronical [*sic*] of important dates in the history of the Papworth Village Settlement', 1917-50. This is clearly an extended version of the lists found in the Varrier-Jones papers (County Record Office Cambridge 1383/1/10) and in the 'Papworth Village Settlement Archive' (1140/1/8).

The last item determines, at 1950, the earliest date at which the History can have been duplicated. The style of *Oxford Loxon* laced loose-leaf binder used to contain the duplicated sheets suggests this was probably c.1960 and perhaps indeed shortly before it was presented to the office.

The National Film and Television Archive at the British Film Institute created these video versions from masters it made from nitrate-based 35mm. cine film (in three cases from an intermediary 16mm. safety film print) shortly after its acquisition in 1988. These nitrate originals themselves derive from Frank Jordan's 'Papworth Village Settlement Archive' (see County Record Office Collection 1140) deposited in the County Record Office in 1988, but, because of their specialist preservation needs and the hazard they presented to other records from potential combustion, they had been separated from the remainder and passed to the National Film Archive at the time of its deposit in the County Record Office. In the following list, reference is given to cine copies of the original film on 16mm. safety stock also existing in the remainder of the collection in the County Record Office. They are use copies and may be requested in the search room.

Edmund Groves was radiographer at Papworth c.1928-1965. In this position he became in effect the official photographer to the Settlement. The depositor, himself later a radiographer at Papworth Hospital, rescued them from impending destruction some years before their deposit.

Altogether there are 171 glass and celluloid negatives, covering the period c.1928-1958. In the following list the intermediate numbers refer to the original boxes containing the lantern slides, some of which had labels giving information about the contents in Groves' own hand. These labels have been retained though the slides have now been re-boxed in archive boxes. The descriptions form the basis of those given in the list below. At the time of deposit the Record Office took the opportunity to photocopy photographic prints made from the negatives by the depositor and entries in the list marked with an asterisk indicate that a photocopy print of the negative is available.

Some of the negatives of the Isle of Man Tourist Trophy motorcycle races have deteriorated, with the emulsion peeling. Unless otherwise stated, the remainder are in good condition. They are all glass negatives, except 1720/4/11-22 (a series of Blackpool holiday photos), which are on celluloid,
