<b>Renewable energy</b>		increase the amount of electricity generated from renewable sources to 10MW by 2001 and 20MW, or more, by 2006. 1994 level 1.75 MW. (Cams. Structure Plan 1995)
<b>Commercial / Industrial</b>	reducing the amount of industrial and commercial waste going to landfill to 85% of 1998 levels by 2005 (Waste Strategy 2000).	
<b>Packaging</b>	recover 38% in 1999, 43% in 2000 and 56% in 2001 and for 2002 the target is 62% (18% of which must be recycled) (Producer Responsibility Obligations (Packaging Waste) Regulations 1997)	
<b>Landfill of Waste</b>	<p>EU Landfill Directive Targets:</p> <p>to reduce the amount of biodegradable municipal waste going to landfill to 75% of the total amount (by weight) of such waste produced in 1995, by 2006.</p> <p>to reduce the amount of biodegradable municipal waste going to landfill to 50% of the total amount (by weight) of such waste produced in 1995, by 2013.</p> <p>to reduce the amount of biodegradable municipal waste going to landfill to 35% of the total amount (by weight) of such waste produced in 1995, by 2020.</p> <p>(The UK Government has exercised the option of postponing the attainment of these targets by four years).</p> <p>hazardous and liquid waste will be progressively banned from active and new sites from 2002 to 2009.</p>	reduce the percentage of controlled waste disposed of to landfill by 10% by 2006 (subject to alternative environmentally satisfactory measures of disposal) whilst minimising the overall growth of controlled waste. 1994 level 70%.
