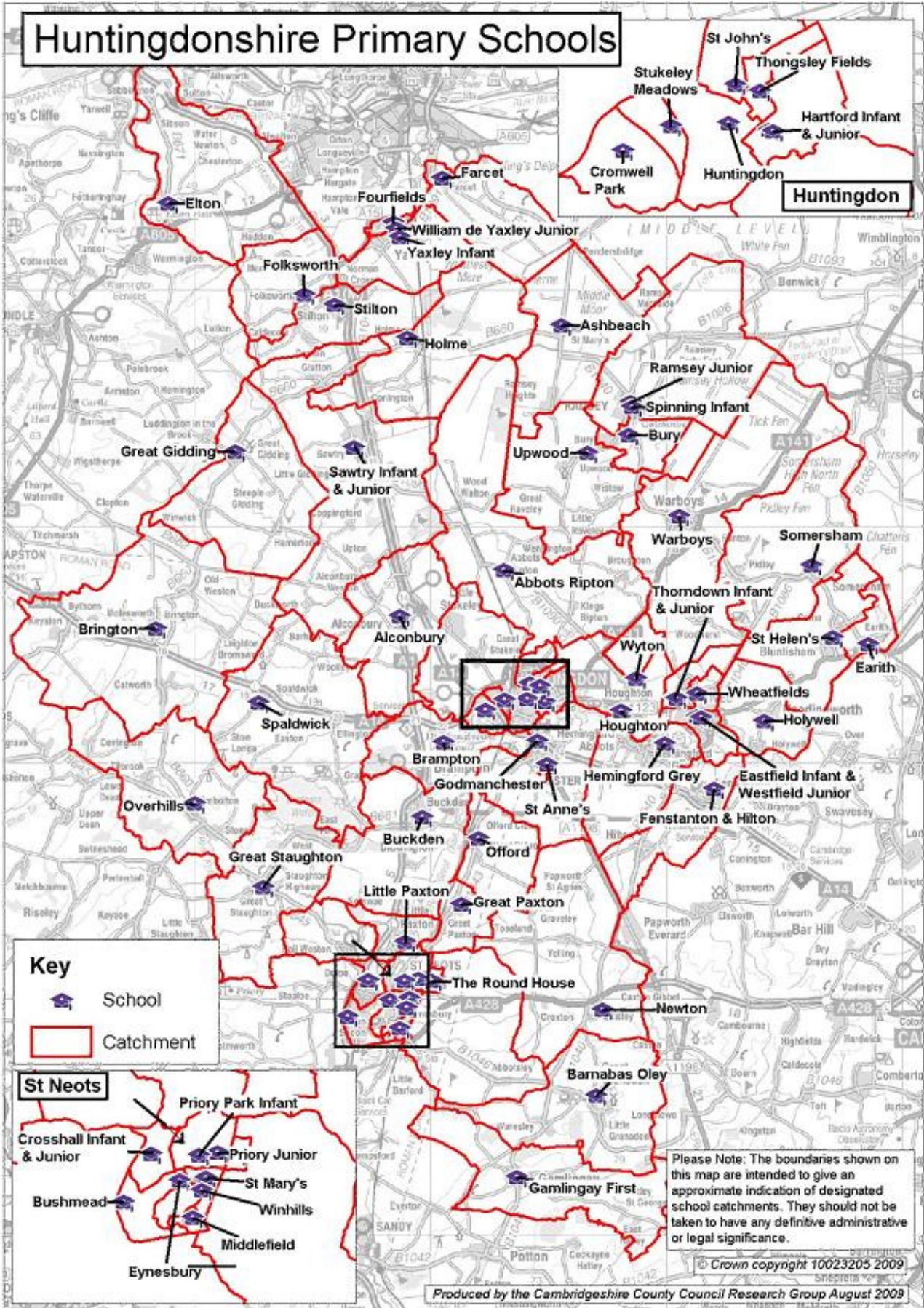

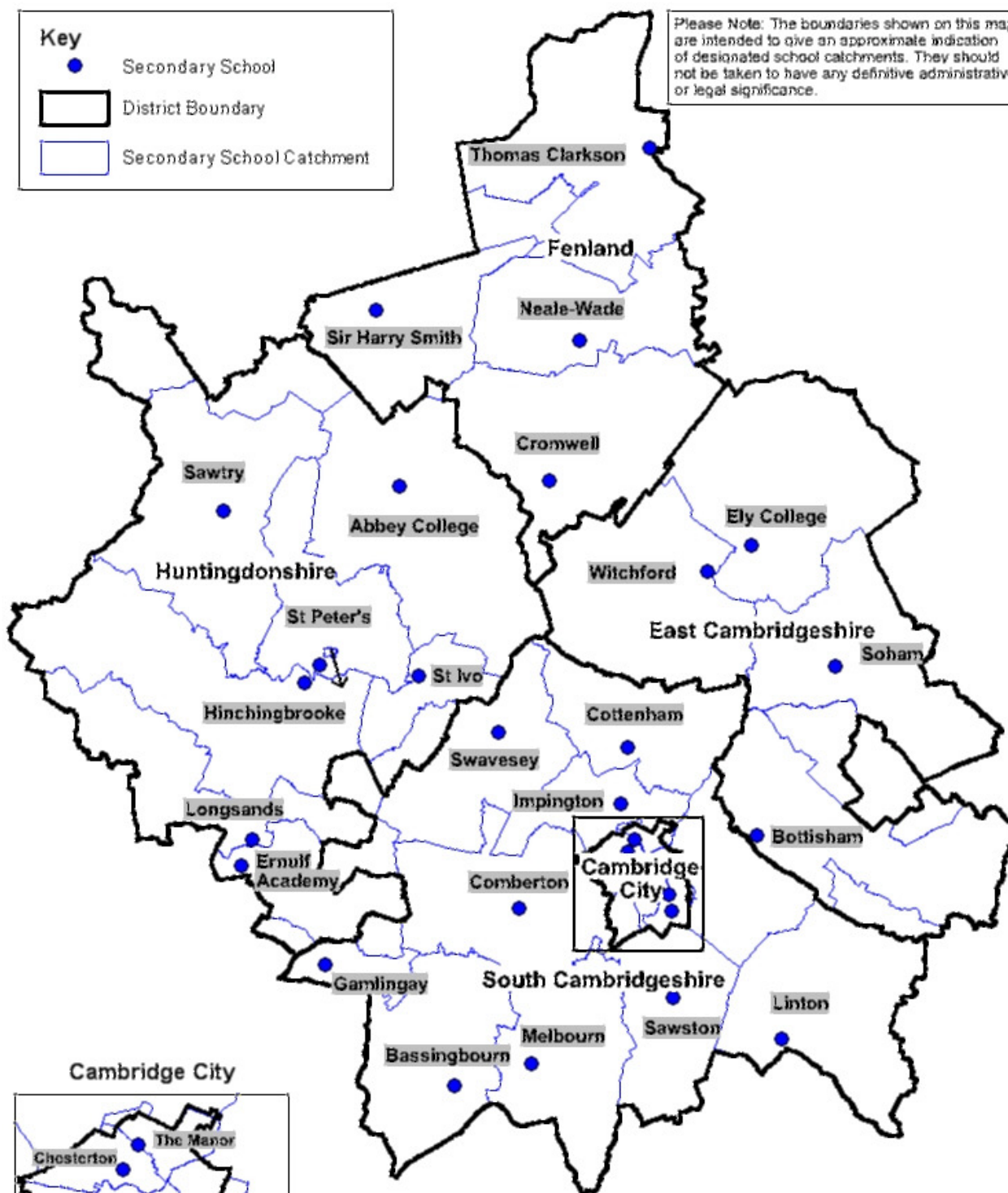

4. live in the catchment areas of the following St Neots primary schools: Crosshall Junior, Priory Junior and the Round House Primary School;
5. attend one of the catchment schools named in 3 above;
6. attend one of the catchment schools named in 4 above;
7. are applying for a place in an existing year group and have the established attendance of a sibling at the College;
8. live outside the areas defined by 3 and 4 above.

As a tiebreaker in any category, children living nearest the college, measured by the shortest straight line distance, would have the highest priority. Straight line distance is measured from the centre point of the home to the College gates situated at the Kings Road entrance or the Longsands Road entrance, whichever is the shorter.
