Hardwick village has a regular service throughout the day providing links to Cambridge and St Ives (Whippet 1). There is an additional service providing a link to Cambridge in the morning and returning in the evening (Stagecoach 14). Additionally Stagecoach Citi 4 serves Hardwick turn. Shippea Hill, Little Ouse and Wood Fen Road have no alternative service. Little Downham has three journeys into and back from Ely, Monday to Saturday, on service 125. Littleport has an hourly service 9 into Ely on Mondays to Saturdays. As well as facilities within Ely itself on Mondays to Saturdays between Cambridge and Ely services 9 and X9 give a combined frequency of every 30 minutes. Between Ely and March on Mondays to Saturdays there is an hourly service. Between Ely and Newmarket on Monday to Saturday there is an hourly service 12, where connections can be made to an hourly service 11 to Bury St Edmunds. In addition a direct rail service operates between Ely and Bury St Edmunds.	ESDAR offers excursion trips to Bury St Edmunds monthly (usually 2 nd or 3 rd Wednesday of each month), door-stop pick-up between 9.30am/10.30am, offering return from 2.00pm. For service X14, although there is no alternative direct service to Cambridge Regional College and Science Park there are journeys into Cambridge from Huntingdon, Hartford and St Ives on Mondays to Saturdays six times per hour up to 18:00 and then hourly until 23:00 on a combination of services 1A, 5, 45 and 55. There are journeys into Cambridge from Fenstanton on Monday to Saturday four times per hour up to 18:00 and then two journeys after 18:00 through a combination of 1A, 5, 15 and 45. Bar Hill also has the same level of service as Huntingdon, Hartford and St Ives but through a combination of services 1A, 5, 15 and Citi5. Fen Drayton is served by service 15 providing journeys to Cambridge on an hourly basis, Monday to Saturday. From the centre of Cambridge, Cambridge Regional College (via Citi1) and Cambridge Science Park (via Citi2) can be accessed every 10 minutes, Monday to Saturday from approximately 08:00 until 18:30 and then every 30 minutes until 23:00. 46 (off-peak) Streetly End - Brinkley: There are no alternative services from Streetly End. There are no alternative direct services to Newmarket from Horseheath, Linton, Balsham, West Wrating, West Wickham, Weston Green, Weston Colville and Brinkley. There is an alternative service 13/13A to Cambridge or Haverhill from Horseheath and Linton up to every 30 minutes during the day, Monday to Saturday, and hourly on Monday to Saturday evenings and Sunday. There is one peak journey to Cambridge on service 16A from Balsham, West Wrating, West Wickham, Weston Green, Weston Colville and Brinkley. In addition, there are three direct journeys to Cambridge and four direct journeys to Haverhill during the day from Balsham, West Wrating and West Wickham using service 16. Five journeys to Cambridge or Haverhill can be made during the day by using service 19 from Balsham, West Wrating, Weston Green, Weston Colville, Brinkley then connecting to service 13/13A at Linton.		
46 (off - peak) Carlton - Newmarket: There are alternative services to Newmarket from Carlton, Burrough Green, Westley Waterless, Dullingham, Stetchworth, Ashley, Cheveley, Saxon Street, Ditton Green and Kirtling using a combination of 901, 902, 903 and 904. There is one journey in each direction on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday.
