

CAMBRIDGESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(RESTRICTED ROADS) (NO) ORDER 200
AND (40MPH SPEED LIMIT) (NO) ORDER 200
IMPOSITION OF 30MPH AND 40MPH SPEED LIMITS ON THE B1049
HISTON AND IMPINGTON

The Cambridgeshire County Council proposes to make Orders under Sections 82, 83, and 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act the effect of which will be:

(a) to impose 30mph speed limits on:

(b) to impose a 40mph speed limit on:

The existing 40mph speed limit on Cottenham Road and the unaffected length of Glebe Way will be revoked and re-enacted by the proposed 40mph Speed Limit Order.

The draft Orders, together with maps showing the roads and lengths of road concerned, and a Statement of the Council's Reasons for proposing to make the Orders, may be examined at the office of the undersigned, and at the office of The Chief Executive, South Cambridgeshire District Council, South Cambridgeshire Hall, Cambourne Business Park, Cambourne, Cambridge CB23 6EA during normal office hours.
