

Guided Busway facts

- When the busway opens it will offer a reliable, fast and frequent public transport alternative to long and slow queues on the busy A14. The busway has been built to a very high standard to make sure the ride for passengers is both smooth and comfortable.
- Buses will operate on the busway from 6am to midnight.
- Between 7am and 7pm, Monday to Saturday, there will be at least 6 buses per hour going from St Ives to Cambridge. From Huntingdon to Cambridge there will be 3 buses per hour.
- Two bus companies (Stagecoach and Whippet Coaches) will run services on the busway. Stagecoach's new guided buses will run on 100% bio diesel made from sustainable sources. Bio diesel buses produce up to 80% less carbon emissions than conventional buses.
- Expected journey times:

- A wide range of tickets will be available on the busway, including Stagecoach's Dayrider and Megarider, Go Whippet's multi-journey tickets and also multi-operator tickets. Concessionary bus passes will also be valid on the busway (under the same terms and conditions as on other buses).

- You will be able to pay for your ticket at a ticket machine at the stops or use a pre-paid smartcard.
- There will be 14 stops on the busway: St Ives P&R, Fen Drayton Nature Reserve, Swavesey, Longstanton P&R, Oakington, Histon & Impington, Orchard Park (2), Cambridge Regional College, Science Park, Cambridge Railway Station, Addenbrooke's Hospital, Trumpington and Trumpington P&R.
- Bus stops along the busway and in Cambridge will have raised platforms, high-quality bus shelters, real-time passenger information, ticket machines and covered cycle parking.
- The new Park & Ride at St Ives will have 500 spaces with room to extend to 1000 and the new Park & Ride at Longstanton will have 350 spaces with room to extend to 700.
- A new bridleway/cycleway will be built next to the busway for walkers, cyclists and horse-riders to access the Cambridgeshire countryside and carry out commutes to and from work.
- The busway will be the longest guided busway in the world. The busway is 40km long in total with guided sections of just over 25km.
