

## Public Notice

### Cambridgeshire County Council (St Ives Town Centre) (Pedestrian Zone and Traffic Restrictions) (Variation) Order 2024

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 15<sup>th</sup> of May 2024 the Cambridgeshire County Council (“CCC”) has made an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and of all other enabling powers the effect of which is to:

Reduce the length of the northernmost loading bay on the eastern side of Bridge Street, St Ives by 5 metres (removed from the northern end of the bay) and introduce bicycle parking measures in its stead.

The Order gives permanent effect to the experimental Order titled “CCC (St Ives Town Centre) (Pedestrian Zone and Traffic Restrictions) Experimental (Variation) Order 2022”.

A copy of the Order, which comes into operation on the 24<sup>th</sup> of May 2024 together with a map showing the effects of the Order and a Statement of the Reasons for having made the Order, may be inspected online on the Council’s website at the following address <https://shorturl.at/cjnIQ> - see reference PR0828.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks from the 15<sup>th</sup> of May 2024 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
