Cambridgeshire County Council, (Main Street, Great Gidding) (Disabled Persons Parking Place), Order 2024

The Cambridgeshire County Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 32(1) and 35(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") as amended by the Road Traffic Regulation (Parking) Act 1986 and of all other enabling powers after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:

Part 1 General

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 23rd day of May 2024 and may be cited as the "Cambridgeshire County Council (Main Street, Great Gidding) (Disabled Persons Parking Place) Order 2024".

2. (i) In this Order-

"Council" means the Cambridgeshire County Council;

"Disabled Parking Place" means any area of carriageway which is indicated by a road marking complying with Diagram 1028.3 (variant) in Schedule 6 and a sign complying with Diagram 661A in Schedule 2 of The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in Regulation 2(1) of The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000 as amended by The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations 2000;

"Driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a Disabled Parking Place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the Disabled Parking Place;

"Parking Disc" has the same meaning as in Regulation 8(5) of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"Relevant Position" has the same meaning as in Regulation 4 of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.

- (ii) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

- (iii) The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
- (iv) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment.

Part 2 authorisation and use of disabled parking place

- 3. (i) Each of the parts of a road specified in the Schedule to this Order is authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order as a Disabled Parking Place on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to that part of road in the said Schedule.
 - (ii) Nothing in paragraph (i) in this Article shall restrict the power of the Council, for preventing obstruction of the streets or in the general interest of road safety, by order on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination, or where the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed, to close any Disabled Parking Place.
4. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in a Disabled Parking Place referred to in Article 3 of this Order:-
- (i) unless it is a vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Person's Badge;
 - (ii) unless it is wholly within a Disabled Parking Place marked by the white lines.
5. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a Disabled Parking Place:-
- (i) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons, or so as to be a nuisance;
 - (ii) when for preventing obstruction of the streets, the Council shall by order made on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination, or where the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed have closed that Disabled Parking Place and exhibited notice of such closing on or near the Disabled Parking Place.
6. The driver of a motor vehicle using a Disabled Parking Place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the Disabled Parking Place, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the Disabled Parking Place.

 - (i) No person shall use or cause or permit the use of a vehicle, while it is in a Disabled Parking Place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the Disabled Parking Place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.
 - (ii) No person shall use or cause or permit the use of any part of a Disabled Parking Place or any vehicle left in a Disabled Parking Place -
 - (a) for sleeping or camping or cooking; or
 - (b) for the purpose of servicing or washing any vehicle or part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable that vehicle to depart from the Disabled Parking Place.
 - (iii) Neither the driver of a vehicle using a Disabled Parking Place nor any other person shall use the horn or other similar instrument except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the Disabled Parking Place.
 - (iv) No person shall use or cause or permit the use of a vehicle, while it is in a Disabled Parking Place, to load or unload goods or burden carried for hire or reward to or from another vehicle.
8. Subject to the proviso hereto, when a vehicle is left or used in a Disabled Parking Place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in Articles 4. 5. 6. and 7 of this Order a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that Disabled Parking Place: provided that when a vehicle is waiting in a Disabled Parking Place in contravention of the provision of Article 4(ii), a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with that provision.
9. Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of the last preceding Article of this Order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle in such a manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it or alter its position, as the case may be.
10. When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a Disabled Parking Place by virtue of Article 8 of this Order, he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.
