L-18 vessels These are all the post-1862 records of Wisbech-  
registered ships that could be identified by official numbers in  
1970 subsequent to the Public Record Office identifying a 10%  
sample on the basis of number (now BT99) and the National  
Maritime Museum accepting in addition to those records for  
1861-62, records of any year ending –5, except 1945, up to  
1965. Subsequent to this selection and distribution process the  
Memorial University of Newfoundland acquired the remaining  
unclaimed records (75% of the total bulk) – see
