NOTICE OF CREATION OF A PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY BY AGREEMENT SECTION 25 HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Cambridgeshire County Council Colne Fen Bridleway Public Path Creation Agreement 2023

Cambridgeshire County Council hereby gives notice, under section 25(6) of the Highways Act 1980, that on the 11 December 2023 it entered into an Agreement under section 25 of the Highways Act 1980 with the landowner to create a new public bridleway in Colne and Earith. The Agreement came into effect on 12 March 2024. The public bridleway starts at a junction with Chatteris Road (public road) at OSGR TL 37317 78294 (point A) and proceeds in a generally south-east direction crossing a drain for approximately 5 metres to a point south of the drain at OSGR TL 37321 78291 (point B). The bridleway then continues generally south-east for approximately 255 metres to a junction with Public Footpath No. 9, Colne at OSGR TL 3754 7816 (point C). The bridleway then continues in a generally south-east direction along a field edge, and the alignment of Public Footpath No. 9, Colne, for approximately 271 metres to a copse at OSGR TL 3777 7801 (point D). The bridleway then continues generally southeast along the alignment of Public Footpath No. 10, Colne for approximately 277 metres to OSGR TL 3794 7780 (point E). The bridleway then continues generally southeast for approximately 302 metres to a point on Colne Long Drove at OSGR TL 3809 7755 (point F). The bridleway then continues along Colne Long Drove generally southwest for approximately 160 metres to OSGR TL 3796 7745 (point G). The bridleway then continues generally south-east to the west of Irrigation Lake, Trout Lake and Rhee Lake for approximately 710 metres to a point at OSGR TL 3837 7688 (point H). The bridleway then continues generally east-north-east for approximately 89 metres to a point at OSGR TL 3843 7695 (point I). The public bridleway has a width of 4 metres with the exception of two pinch-points at OSGR TL 3777 7800 (point D1) and OSGR TL 3826 7704 (point G1) where the width is 3.8 metres. The public bridleway has been dedicated by the landowner subject to the following limitations: steel bollards spaced a minimum of 1.525 metres apart at OSGR TL 37317 78294 (point A), OSGR TL 37321 78291 (point B), OSGR TL 3777 7801 (point D), OSGR TL 3794 7780 (point E) and OSGR 3838 7688 (point H).
