

[Home](#) > [News](#) > Warning to beware EU settled status scams

With Brexit approaching, Trading Standards is warning EU citizens about scammers offering to help apply for "settled status" for a fee when the scheme is completely free.

Some people may be offering this service, but there is no guarantee that they will actually apply on EU citizens' behalf, while the scammer would also have access to personal information so they could try to steal identities.

From 29th March, EU citizens wishing to remain in the UK after December 2020 need to apply for settled status. This is a free application which can be done online or via an app. Support is available from many local community groups.
