- 7. The Deputy Chief Executive of Environment and Community Services of the Cambridgeshire County Council shall issue permits only to the following:
  - (i) landowners or tenants requiring access to land accessible only from the length of road referred to in Article 3;
  - (ii) Statutory Undertakers carrying out statutory duties on or adjacent to the length of road referred to in Article 3;
  - (iii) the Emergency Services;
  - (iv) Local Authorities carrying out statutory duties on the length of road referred to in Article 3;
- 8. The Council are satisfied that for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising it is requisite that Section 3(1) of the Act should not apply to this Order.

NOTICE is hereby given that on 6 March 2006 the Cambridgeshire County Council has made an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and of all other enabling powers the effect of which is to prohibit the driving of all vehicles, including two wheeled motorised vehicles, and horse drawn vehicles, on a length of Byway Open to all Traffic No. 2 Catworth. The order will commence from the existing gates at the northern end of the Byway, adjacent to the A14, in a southerly direction for a distance of 5 metres.

Access will be maintained for pedestrians, pedal cyclists and equestrians.

Lockable gates will give effect to this order.

A copy of the Order, which comes into operation on 17 March 2006 together with a map showing the effects of the Order and a Statement of the Reasons for having made the Order, may be inspected at the office of the undersigned and at the offices of The Chief Executive, Huntingdonshire District Council, Pathfinder House, St Mary's Street, Huntingdon during normal office hours.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks from 6 March 2006 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
